Americans w/Disabilities Act: In addition to ADA, the Uniformed Services Employment & Reemployment Rights Act (USERRA) and Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC) provide enforcement for individuals who work for companies w/15 or more people. These laws require reasonable accommodations to be in place to meet special disability needs.

SOCIAL SECURITY: Don't forget to ask about credits for your Vietnam Service! You're entitled to a \$300 per quarter in ea year you served active duty. Service thru 1967 the credit is added when you apply, 1968 and after is supposed to be automatic??

SURVIVOR BENEFITS: Widows are eligible under Comp., Indemnification & Dependency (CID). Certain restrictions apply. Widows of 100% service-connected disabled Vets are more easily approved. Ask your local VA about details.

PTSD AWARD ?: Legislation surfaced July 2008 to award those w/PTSD the Purple Heart award, stay tuned.

COMBAT ACTION BADGE: New legislation has been submitted to approve more Vets to wear the badge. Current law does not include Vietnam Vets. The biggest hang-up is language as to exactly who would be eligible to wear the badge.

Start Planning Now! The best way to insure your old comrades will be attending the reunion is to make arraignments to meet in Omaha! Have "Davo" e-mail you an up-dated roster with over 800 Vets. Listed. Searches for Vets will continue up to the reunion.

Parking: Those with cars will be issued a free pass for the Central City Parking Garage on 17th St. across from the hotel when registering at front desk.

RV Parking: Either Free on-siteor on-street around the hotel for a one-time "meter bagging" fee of \$30 for all RV's, drivers pay \$10 per meter per day for weekdays. Saturdays and Sundays are free. A long RV taking (2) regular spaces pays \$20 a day through Friday night. ALL RV Drivers **MUST** contact the reunion host in advance to make arraignments for on-site or have the city bag the correct number of meters and assign numbers.

ROOMS:Check-in time is 3-PM. Arriving early?, check in and go to our hospitality room to wait for an open room. Check-Out time is NOON. Room discount is good for (3) before/after the reunion dates. Rooms are guaranteed via credit card, refunds

Hotel Accommodations: This "Hilton" features deluxe rooms, swimming pool, sauna, work-out room and computer room.

There's the City Center Pub, Signature Restaurant w/a Breakfast Buffet M-F 6:30-9:30am, Sat 7-11am, Sun? \$13.83 w/tx. There are 36 bars, clubs, and restaurants within a six blocks.

Shuttle buses that hold about 15 people run every 15 minutes. They can be used for various places, including the Old Market District. Some places have their own buses as the Ameristar Casino. This casino is 10 minutes away and has a great buffet.

The Hotel bus runs about 5am to 11pm, about every 15 minutes.

Vietnam Parasite Up-Date:

Don Trent's widow Pat Trent called to mention she believes Don may have been exposed to the parasite that is linked to the Cholangiocarcinoma cancer of the bile tract. The parasite is found in Vietnam and surrounding countries, and rare in the US.

The parasite is also linked to Hepatitis-C and water ingestion. The Foremost company made our powdered milk we drank. It is doubtful the powdered milk was contaminated, but it was mixed into water which was supposed to be "potable"; safe to drink. On the other hand, "Ice" may be the source?

Potable ice was delivered to batteries now and then. But it may be the ice used to cool soda and beer in cans sold to Vets by the locals along the roads and in villages. It's highly unlikely the locals used treated water to make ice!

When Vets needed a "Cold One", many bought drinks along the roads. If the ice and water the cans cooled in wasn't treated, this is the likely means of any exposure through water on and around, and some on top rim of the cans. I doubt wiping the cans would remove all contamination.

PTSD & Smoking:

Recent media reports of the VA combining PTSD & smoking cessation included Varenicline, a drug (Chantix) used in process. The FDA advised on potential side effects, and a study is being done. Also issued was a warning that the topic of suicide and/or PTSD should be dealt with on personal levels and in clinics, not by letters to Veterans alone. .

Ferocious Firepower Newsletter:

Found is a short "Allons" type newsletter from approx. Mar 68 when the 7/15th was teamed up w/ the 6/16th FA. Gen. John Tolson (1st Cav. Air-Mobile) lauded the outstanding artillery support of our units in the Pershing AO.

LTC David Ferebee Jr. said the tribute is due to the professional ability of the men of our BN.

Op. Silver Thunderbolt: 1300 hrs 26 Mar 68 under 1LT Larry Riley, 2-8" roared from LZ Up-Lift to direct-fire style battle. Moving NE into the Valley, 10k's w/the 1/50th Mech., as security, B-Btry. blasted the entrance of caves used by the enemy. Enemy VC brought in by the 1/50th stood dazed after watching "Great Balls of Fire: filled w/steel covering football-field size areas.

A-Btry., covered w/dust, moved to LZ Pony in record time under Cpt. James Butler.

In Dec 1967, Maj. Ray Gatti was promoted to LTC. Ray was assign'd to G-3 Plans Division 1FFV in Nha Trang prior to the 7/15 FA. Upon receiving his new position, he immediately started a BN Maint. Program to insure our units readiness.

There's mention of C/6/16th FA and it's unclear if we worked with the entire unit.

This new newsletter mentions new names not found on our limited amount of rosters we have.

Although there are many names mentioned in this news, they are too many to mention at this time. The complete text will appear in a future newsletter.

Reduce Heating Bills:

With the rise in cost to heat your home, your best bet is insulating. The (2) areas that have the most heat loss; attics and foundation box sills. Both areas also have the best pay-back period (2-1/2 yrs). This means the amount you spend on insulating those areas are returned in lower bills.

Old standards were R-19 or 8-inches of attic insulation with a moisture barrier, and new construction is now R-30.

You must have adequate venting to make insl work well. Std. rule is 1 Sq. Ft per 300 Sq. ft. of attic area, 50% of which are loc'd high on the roof, and 50% in the eaves or lower roof.

Box sills are the small area above your basement wall and in between the ceiling floor joists. You can fit about R-19 of fiberglass batt into the area. You can caulk any gaps where air penetrates on the interior. Brown craft-paper is NOT to be used in this area as a moisture barrier due to fire codes.

Replacement of windows have always had poor payback, consider them if you keep your home longer than 10 years.

Old furnaces are about 80% efficient, new units 90-95% but can have problems in design. Be sure you have a good warranty, especially on the heat exchanger, electrics, and labor. Payback varies as to costs.

Boilers are expensive to buy, require yrly or 2-yr service, but cheapest to run.

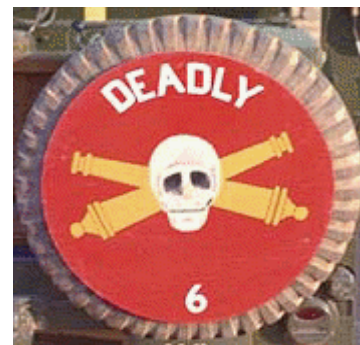

MISC. REUNION INFORMATION

AIRLINES & BAGGAGE: Keep in mind the new rules for “Carry-On” & “Checked Baggage”!

Most airlines allow (1) Carry-On, some now appear to allow only (1) checked bag free. You can search info online, or ask about this when you make reservations. For example, the Midwest website shows them allowing one 50-lb checked bag “free”, but suggests all checked bags no more then 62 inches total dia. They mention fees for over size and weight of \$50 or more.

Carry-On liquids appear the same as 2007, very small amounts in a sandwich type baggie.

While expecting much higher flight costs, Midwest offered a RT fare (\$250) equal to 2007 prices!

FRIDAY AFTERNOON TOURS:

Both tours take places after our Memorial Service, Biz Meeting, and “Photo Shoot”.

Our hosts added a museum tour for those who don’t care to try their luck at the casinos in Council Bluffs IA. Casino shuttle buses run regular and you can assume most have a lunch buffet of some type. You can check at the front desk as to what casinos offer buses and the exact hours they run.

The SAC Museum tour is planned for a total of approximately 4-5 hours including 1-1/2 hours total boarding and travel time round-trip. There’s a 1/2 to 1-hour lunch room time figured in.
